Johnny Curtis Memorial Junior National Qualifier Medical Response Plan January 17-18 2020

Given the likelihood of needed medical resources for an event of this size Jackson Hole Ski and Snowboard Club will use the following response guidelines for this event.

- 1. Jackson Hole Ski and Snowboard Club will provide an on site medical resource (EMT, RN, MD or other qualified individual). The role of the on site medical provider will be respond to reported injuries on the course and coordinate the care and transport of injured athletes to awaiting EMS units or parent/coaches as the situation dictates.
 - The on site medical resource will carry a radio and be in communication with course monitors to help effect a timely response.
 - The on site medical resource will have access to immobilization, splinting and other emergency medical supplies needed to help treat and transport injured athletes safely.
 - The on site medical resource will have access to a ski toboggan, snowmobile, and snowmobile toboggan to assist with transport.
- 2. Jackson Hole Ski and Snowboard Club will rely on Jackson Hole Fire/EMS for emergency medical transport to St. John's Medical Center for those athletes who require further evaluation.
 - Jackson Hole Fire/EMS maintains two ambulances 24/7 with an EMT/Paramedic Crew. (Medic 10 and Medic 60)
 - Medic 60 is stationed on the Teton Village Road (5-10 min response to Trail Creek Venue)
 - Medic 10 is stationed on Pearl Street in the town of Jackson (15 min response)
- 3. St. John's Medical Center is a Wyoming Area Trauma Hospital capable of evaluating and treating most traumatic injuries. The Emergency Room is the primary receiving facility for Jackson Hole Fire/EMS and is open 24/7 and staffed by board certified Emergency Physicians.

On Site Medical Evaluation and Transport Plan:

- The on site medical resource and race director will be notified immediately by radio of any injuries or situations that require a medical evaluation during the event.
- The medical resource will then assess the injury in the field and decide on appropriate transport means back to the trail creek cabin/road access.
- If EMS transport for further evaluation is needed the medical resource will notify the race director immediately to call for an ambulance. (Call 911)
- Emergency stabilizing treatment that is needed will be provided in the field as appropriate to the providers level. Patients will be transported by toboggan or snowmobile to the trail creek cabin where they can be further assessed and await ambulance arrival.
- Coaches and Parents will be allowed access to injured athletes and may help
 with transport decisions as appropriate. If the on site medical provider feels
 that an EMS response is appropriate then athletes will be evaluated by EMS
 regardless of the parent/coach decision of weather to have EMS transport
 the athlete.
